

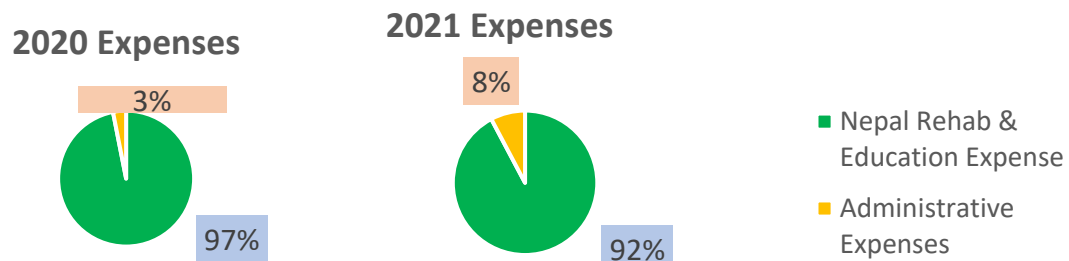
NepalAbility continues to advance rehabilitation in Nepal through education and improving access to therapy and equipment during the COVID-19 pandemic. In addition to focusing on the rehabilitation for individuals living with brain injury, spinal cord injury, and other neurological impairments, we have expanded our education and support to include Cardiac and post COVID-19 Rehabilitation.

As per our signed agreement with the United Mission Hospital Tansen (UMHT), \$12,100.00 CAD was provided in 2021 to support individuals with financial needs in receiving rehabilitation services and therapeutic equipment. The Neuro-Rehab beds at UMHT had to close to accommodate the changing needs of patients during pandemic. The number of patients admitted who received neurological rehabilitation dropped significantly in 2021. The funding supported 9 patients (19 patients in 2020) who received a total of 107 rehabilitation therapy visits (354 visits in 2020). Funding was reallocated to support staff education, wheelchair and equipment purchases, and the therapy gym renovation.



The need to pivot to support virtual education and fundraising events was identified. Expenses towards setting up online platforms to better support education and fundraising is included as part of the Administration expense. This has resulted in an increase in administration expenses in 2021 compared to previous years.

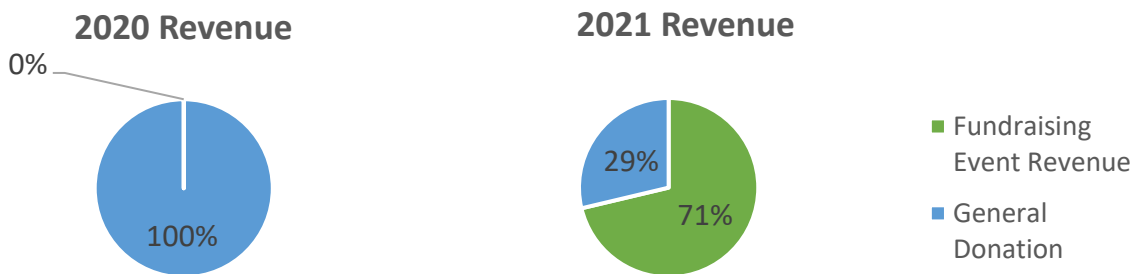


The enhanced online platform allowed us to provide four (4) virtual education webinars in 2021. The webinars covered topics related to Cardiac Rehab, COVID-19 Rehab, and Spinal Cord Injury Rehab. With education being provided virtually, we were able to double our reach and support 4 organizations through our webinars! These included United Mission Hospital Tansen, Green Pasture Rehabilitation Centre and Hospital, Gunjaman Sing Hospital Chitwan, and Okhaldhunga Community Hospital.

In 2021, NepalAbility formed a partnership with The Veritas Foundation. Veritas specializes in evaluating Canadian Charities and provides guidance to donors who are exploring opportunities to donate. Veritas conducted an in-depth review and rated NepalAbility as “BBB” which is in the upper range of “acceptable”. They provided concrete guidance to help better and grow our organization, such as improving our financial reports, and ensuring our website communicates our mission clearly.

100% of our funding comes from generous donors and through our fundraising events. Our fundraising team was busy in 2021! We hosted 2 virtual fundraising events which brought us a lot of joy and energy, as well as much needed funding. Thank you to the many your joined us for *Zumba* and *Style for NepalAbility with Stella & Dot*. We also conducted a successful email campaign aligned with Giving Tuesday, where Veritas and an anonymous donor generously matched all donations received!

The net assets of NepalAbility by the end of 2021 were \$30,597.42 CAD (\$25,855.55 CAD in 2020). This will allow us to meet our financial commitments with UMHT and continue to offer virtual webinars in 2022. As COVID-19 pandemic settles, we hope to resume on-site support in Nepal.
